- Timely developed all relevant documents required to effectively organize the 2nd international conference on evaluating climate change and development. These working documents included but were not limited to a call for abstracts, concept notes, terms of reference, guidelines for abstract review, and other key documents that shaped the strategic direction of the conference and served as a basis for decision making on the steering committee;

- Managed communications among all stakeholders of the strand including evaluation practitioners involved in the climate and environment strand, officials of the African Evaluation Association, the GEF IEO and other policy makers from across the world;
- Contributed to grading abstracts of the AfrEA conference.

PARTNERSHIPS, OUTREACH AND STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT:

 Successfully coordinated the establishment of a working partnership between the GEF Independent Evaluation Office (GEF IEO) and the African Evaluation Association (AfrEA). The formal agreement resulted in the official signing of a working <u>Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)</u> between both institutions in October 2013;

 Initiated and concluded a partnership between evaluation associations and the GEF IEO/Climate-Eval to work in collaboration and better meet the capacity development needs of evaluation practitioners globally. Some of these organizations include the Independent Evaluation group of the World Bank (IEG), the Evaluation Institute of the George Washington University, Better Evaluation and UNDP Service Center in South America in charge of coordinating a regional network of evaluators known as Latin American and the Caribbean Network for Monitoring, Evaluation and Systematization (ReLAC).

COMMUNICATIONS DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT OF DOCUMENTS:

- Successfully developed the communications and stakeholder engagement plan of the 2nd international conference on Evaluating Climate Change and Development and contributed to the implementation and assessment of the strategy;
- Successfully developed the official announcement of the 2nd international conference on Evaluating Climate change and Development, a press release for media.
- Successfully and effectively managed all communications involving various stakeholders of the community of practice, including more than 2000 members composed of senior and mid-level evaluation practitioners and policymakers in
- bilateral and multilateral organizations, regional, national, and local governments, researchers, academes, and other interested parties from think tanks and other organizations interested in climate change and development evaluations;
- Successfully developed the sixth progress report of Climate-Eval Community of Practice in keeping to donors' requests and implementing the plan;
- Successfully designed the monitoring framework of Climate-Eval, which guides the timely implementation of earmarked activities and prevents key parts of the project from being overlooked.

WEBSITE DEVELOPMENT, WRITING, AND EDITING:

- Amidst a competitive context of proliferating climate change knowledge brokerage site focused on climate change, Climate–Eval experienced nearly a 75% increase in the number of visitors. From May 15, 2013, to May 15, 2014, a total of 15,980 visitors went to the website as opposed to 9.308 during the same time in the previous year. Of these visitors, 10,398 were new users representing an increase of about 94%;
- In my first year as community manager, I wrote and published on the Climate-Eval website over 100 articles representing 35 blogs and about 65 news stories. This represents an average of two blogs/news stories per week, resulting in increased commentary, sharing of best practices, further dissemination of important climate change evaluations, and knowledge exchange in general;
- The Climate-Eval electronic depository grew with more than 65 new climate change evaluations/ studies added, and the target of uploading a total of 150 evaluations on the linkages between climate change adaptation and natural resources management by end of 2015 was met;
- Published video interviews with Directors of UNDP and UN Women Independent Evaluation Offices among other video interviews conducted with evaluation practitioners still to be published. Interviews addressed emerging challenges to evaluate climate change, prospects of the practice and other relevant methodological issues. These videos helped diversify the format of knowledge products on the website;
- Contributed to the re-design of the Climate-Eval website and general site development.

MANAGEMENT OF SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORMS (TWITTER, YOUTUBE, LINKEDIN, AND FLICKR)

- The Climate-Eval Twitter platform grew from about 600 tweets in June 2013 to more than 800, representing an average of 3 tweets per week as recommended by the web governance team of the World Bank;
